A housing co-op is a group of people who collectively own and manage their homes. Residents are tenants AND landlords, so rents are low and security is guaranteed in the long term. Co-ops are supportive communities where each person has an equal say in making decisions.

- How can more people to benefit from the long term safety and affordability that co-ops provide?
- How can we make co-ops more equitable, diverse and inclusive?
