## Master Programmes on Labour and Globalization in Germany, South Africa and Brazil

The Global Labour University, a cooperation network of the ILO, the International Labour Movement and several international academic institutions, invites trade unionists to study at two special Master programmes on Labour and Globalization. The University of Kassel and the Berlin School of Economics in Germany are offering in September 2007 a course on 'Labour Policies and Globalization.' The 'Labour and Development' programme starts in January 2008 and is offered by the University of Witwatersrand in South Africa." Students can study partly in Germany and partly in South Africa or go for one semester as a visiting student to the Brazilian GLU partner the Universidade Estadual de Campinas.

The programmes are part of a wider project to promote cooperation between trade unions and the research community and to strengthen the analytical, research and policy development capacity of trade unions. They are targeting trade union experts. Interested trade unionists should now apply. The deadline for submission is 1<sup>st</sup> of April 2007 for Germany (malpg@uni-kassel.de) and 1<sup>st</sup> of October 2007 for South Africa (mandy.moussouris@wits.ac.za). The courses are taught in English. More detailed information and the application form are available on the Internet http://www.global-labour-university.org.

A limited number of scholarships for applicants from developing and transition economies are available. Applicants need to have the endorsement of a trade union to apply for a scholarship. The grant is conditional on a contribution of 1500 Euro from the supporting trade union or another donor.

Please note that women are strongly encouraged to participate and strict gender criteria will be applied in awarding places and scholarships.
