Liz has held a number of roles with (amongst others) the British Geological Survey; the British Trust for Conservation Volunteers; Leicestershire & Rutland Wildlife Trust; and a variety of National Park Authorities including the Peak.

Liz is the Chief Executive of the Sheffield and Rotherham Wildlife Trust. The Trust manages and owns Nature Reserves across the urban area of Sheffield and Rotherham and is working to protect wildlife and restore ecological networks for nature. The Trust also reaches over 10,000 people/year, of all ages, through a wide range of engagement activities, as well as supporting many volunteers and has a growing membership base of over 6,000 local people.

Liz is also a Director of Wildscapes CIC, Green Estate, the River Stewardship Company and Voluntary Action Sheffield.
